# TOTAL ECLIPSE OF THE SUN PARTY At Touch the Sky Prairie

**The Brandenburg Prairie Foundation is pleased to announce an event like no other!**

Join **MN Natureworks bio-botanist Jeffrey Emmel** & Brandenburg Prairie Foundation as they host this special event at **Touch the Sky Prairie**. Bring your brown bag lunch, sun/safety glasses, water and sit back to watch this once in a lifetime celestial event. The eclipse will begin in this area at 11:38 am on Monday, August 21st. The maximum viewing will be at 1:02 pm and over at 2:26 pm.

The total solar eclipse of August 21, 2017 is the first total eclipse visible from America's lower 48 states in over 38 years. The last one happened in 1979 and passed through the Pacific Northwest and central Canada in late winter. This year, the total eclipse passes within a narrow corridor that traverses the United States from the Pacific Northwest to the Southeast crossing a dozen states: Oregon, Idaho, Wyoming, Nebraska, Kansas, Missouri, Illinois, Kentucky, Tennessee, Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina (a tiny corner of Montana and Iowa are also inside the path). A partial eclipse is seen within the much broader path of the Moon's penumbral shadow, which includes all of North America, the northern third of South America, and westernmost Europe and Africa.
